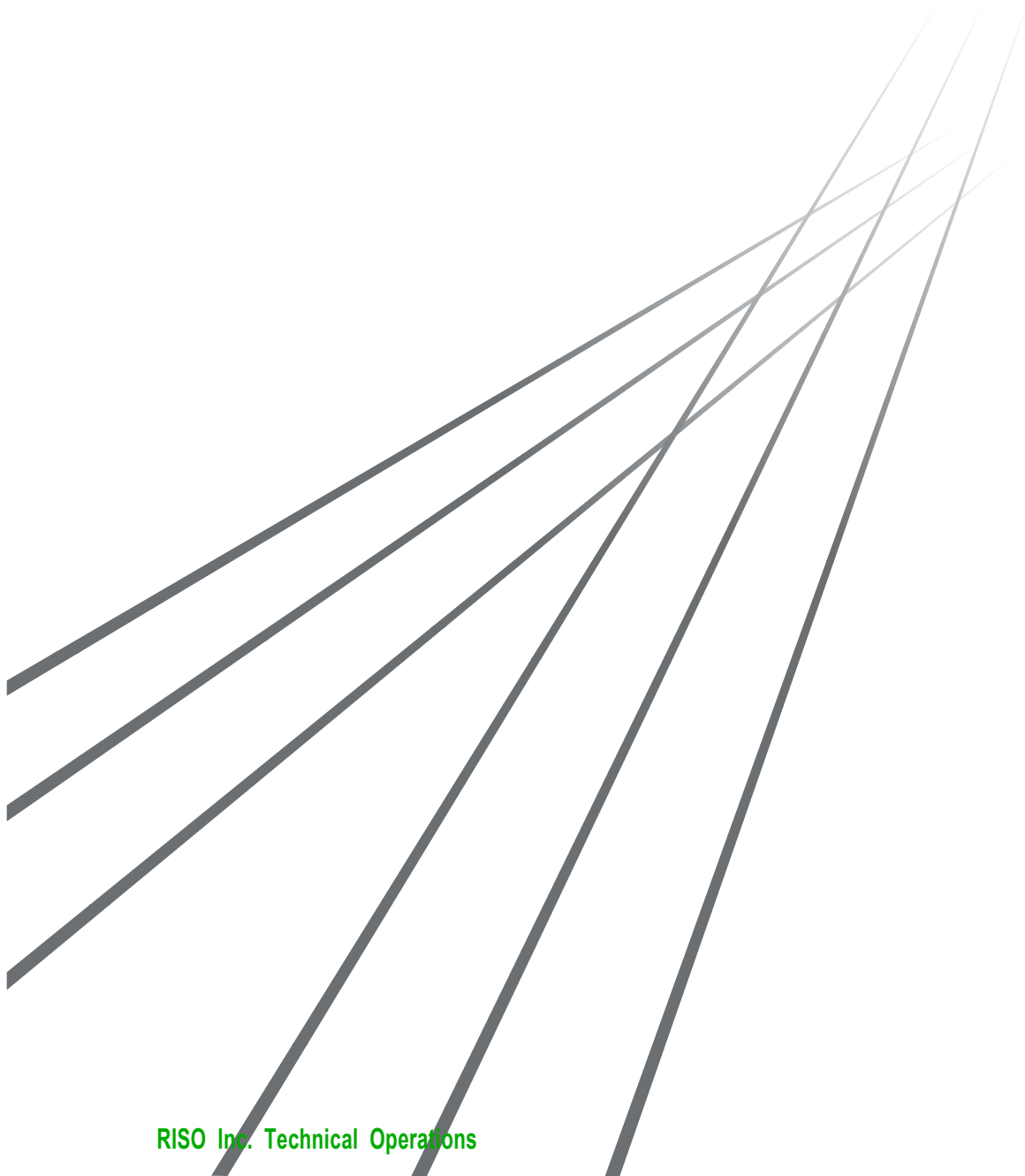

Welcome to the field of high-speed computer printing presented by RISO printers through RISO Printer Drivers. The RISO printers, which are designed to operate as high-speed GDI printers, enable you to print various documents that you create on different computer platforms very speedily, only if an appropriate RISO Printer Driver is installed in your computer.



GDI printers use bit-mapped image data developed on your computer monitor as a print data source, enabling you to print the exact same image as what you see on your computer monitor in most cases. In addition, printer fonts are not required to print documents, thus relieving you of the restrictions on the use of fonts when you create documents on your computer.

The RISO printers can also operate as network printers in various LAN environments, with an additional network interface card embedded inside.

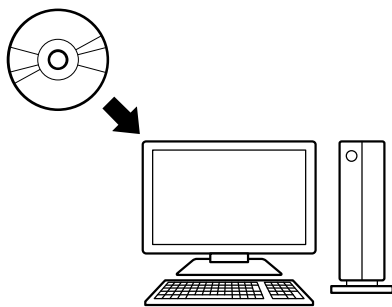
Procedure before printing

Before you use the printer for the first time, perform the installation procedure below.

After installation, follow the basic operation procedure. Then, you can print out documents.



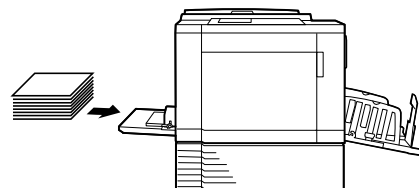

Install the Printer Driver

Install the RISO Printer Driver into your computer. 10

- Depending on the connection method, your computer must be connected to the printer in advance.
- If you cannot connect to a computer, you can print in high quality by using a USB flash drive or [Paper Memory Print].



1. Prepare the printer

Prepare the printer and load print paper suitable for the original data to be printed out onto the standard tray.

- To prepare the printer, read the user's guide of the RISO printer.

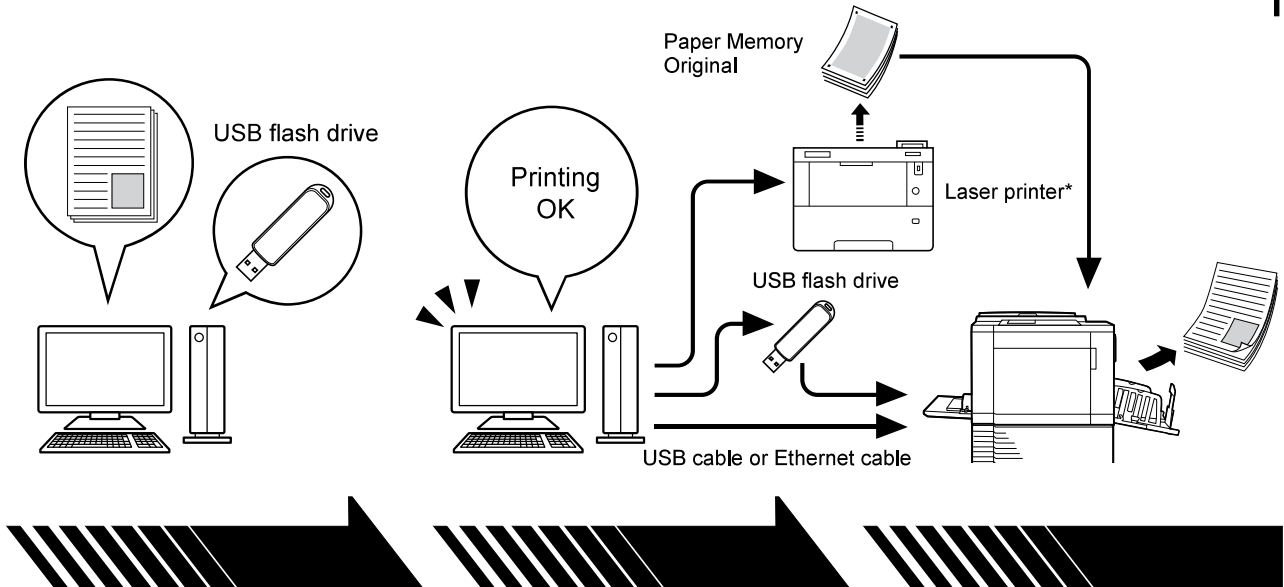

Basic operation

**2. Set**

Open the data you want to print with your computer, select your Printer Driver (or the USB flash-via-Printer Driver) and configure settings for printing.

- To print from a USB flash drive, connect the USB flash drive to your computer.
- To use [Paper Memory Print], select [Paper Memory Print].

3. Print

Open the [Print] dialog on your computer and click [OK]. The data is transmitted to the laser printer or stored in the USB flash drive.

If [Paper Memory Print] is selected, the [Preview and Edit] tool starts. Print the Paper Memory Original with a laser printer*. (49)

4. Printing complete

The printer receives the data, makes a master, and prints.

- To print from a USB flash drive, connect it to the printer.
- When using [Paper Memory Print], the printer reads the Paper Memory Original, makes a master, and prints.

* A laser printer of 600 dpi or more is required to create a Paper Memory Original. However, the RISO printer may not be able to scan it properly depending on the model and print quality of the laser printer.

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Connection methods and Printer Driver types

The types of Printer Drivers are as follows:

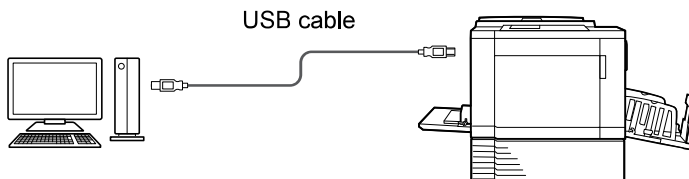
- Printer Driver
- USB flash-via-Printer Driver

Choose the Printer Driver to install according to your environment.

Environment connected via cable

In the following environment, the Printer Driver should be used.

■ When connected via USB cable (11)

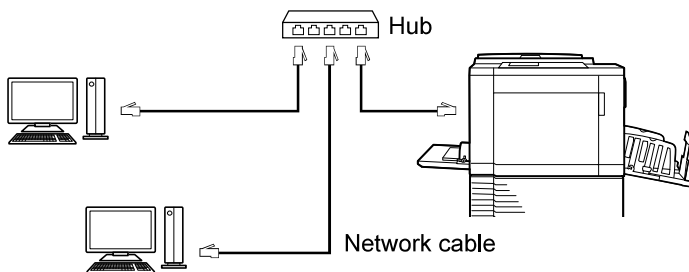


- ▶ Use a commercially available USB A-B type cable (USB 2.0, Hi-speed USB, 3 m or less).



- ▶ [Paper Memory Print] is available even when the printer is connected via USB cable. In this case, you do not need to install the printer driver for [Paper Memory Print] (31).

■ When connected via network (15)



- ▶ Use a commercially available Ethernet STP cable (10BASE-T or 100BASE-TX, category 5 or higher) appropriate for your network environment. (You can use either a straight cable or crossover cable.)
- ▶ You cannot directly connect the machine to a communication line offered by a telecommunication carrier (such as a mobile communications company, fixed-line telecoms company, or Internet provider). When connecting the machine to a network, make sure it is connected via router.

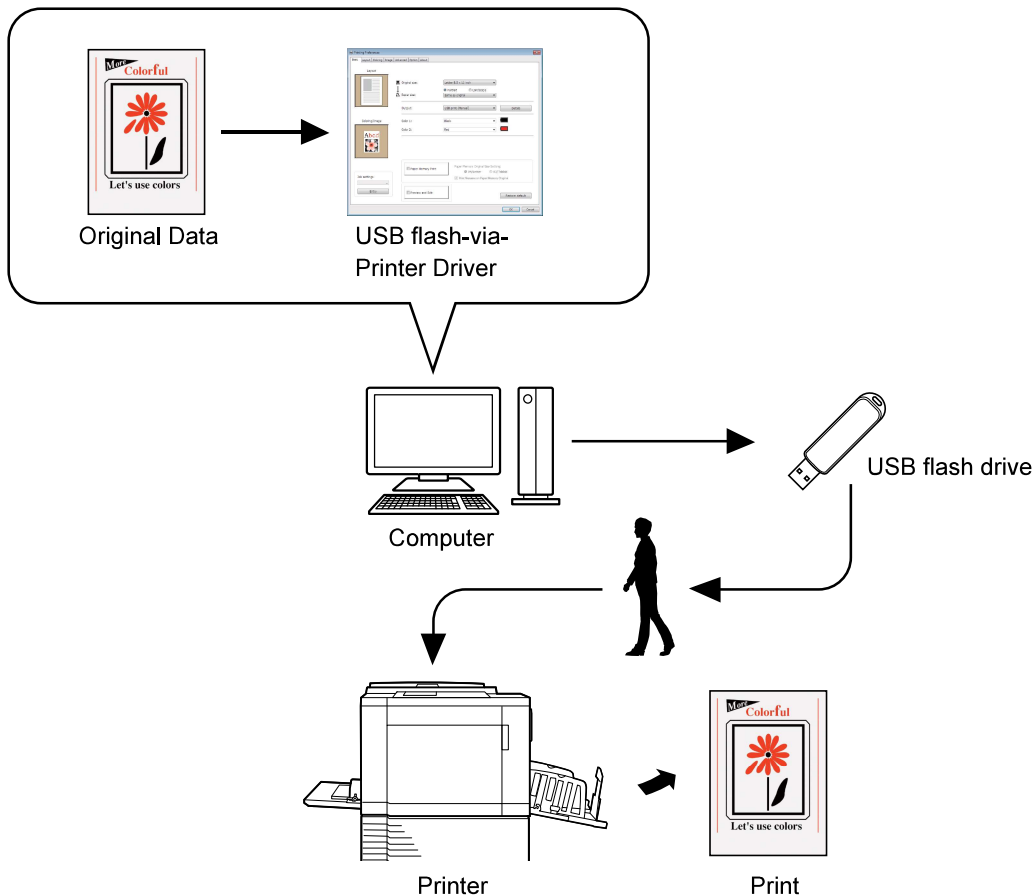


- ▶ [Paper Memory Print] is available even when the printer is connected via network cable. In this case, you do not need to install the printer driver for [Paper Memory Print] (31).

Environment not connected via cable

■ When printing using a USB flash drive

Save the data to the USB flash drive by using the USB flash-via-Printer Driver (📖 23). Connect the USB flash drive to the printer to print the data.



- ▶ Use a USB flash drive compatible with Mass Storage Class. Depending on the type of USB flash drive, the Printer Driver may not work properly.
- ▶ Use a FAT-formatted USB flash drive.
- ▶ USB flash drives with security features are not supported.
- ▶ When connecting or removing a USB flash drive, insert it or pull it out slowly by using the correct method.
- ▶ If USB flash drive data becomes corrupted by natural disaster or accident, the data saved in the USB flash drive cannot be guaranteed to work. Backing up important data to the computer used to create them is recommended.
- ▶ When printing by using a USB flash drive, always create a dedicated folder in the USB flash drive. For details on how to create a folder, refer to "Create a Folder (📖 27)".



- ▶ Even in an environment where the printer and your computer are connected via cable, data can be printed by using a USB flash drive.

■ When printing by using [Paper Memory Print]

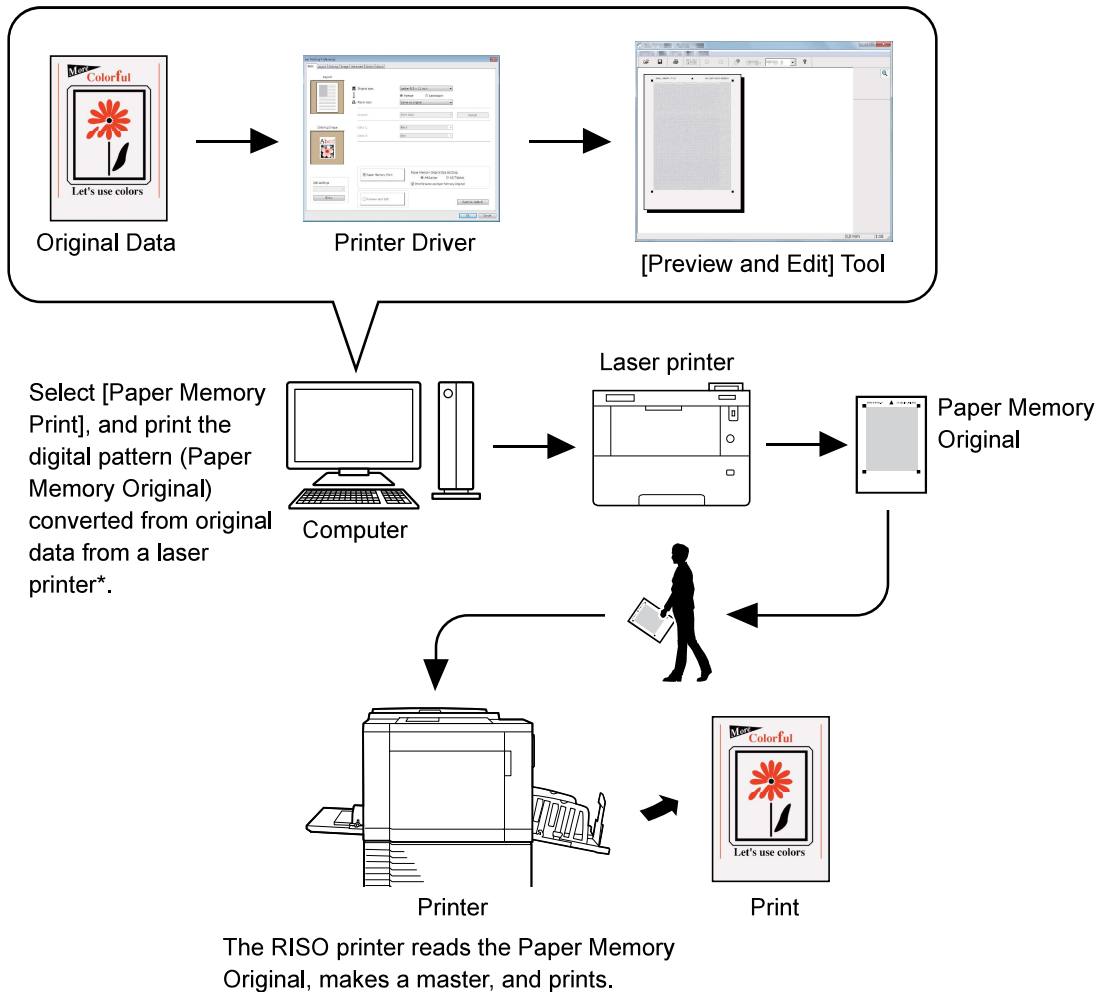
Install the Printer Driver, and use it as the printer driver for [Paper Memory Print]. (10)

You can convert original data created on a computer to a digital pattern using the printer driver function, and print it on a laser printer*. The printed paper is referred to as a "Paper Memory Original".

Using the [Paper Memory Print] function of this machine allows you to reproduce original data from a Paper Memory Original and print it.



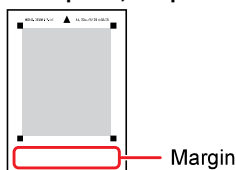
- ▶ To use Paper Memory Print, a separate laser printer* is required. Install the printer driver of the laser printer on your computer, and connect to the printer. For details on installation and connection methods, refer to the user's guide of the laser printer.



* A laser printer of 600 dpi or more is required to create a Paper Memory Original. However, the RISO printer may not be able to scan it properly depending on the model and print quality of the laser printer.



- ▶ A Paper Memory Original may not be scanned appropriately on the printer if it is dirty, creased, or folded.
- ▶ When writing notes on a Paper Memory Original, use the margin indicated in the figure below. If you write on any other place, the printer may not be able to read the original properly.



- ▶ [Paper Memory Print] is available even when the printer is connected to a computer via cable.

This section describes how to install the Printer Driver for Windows supporting Plug&Play installation when your computer and the RISO printer are connected via USB cable.



- ▶ You must have administrator rights to install the Printer Driver on your computer.
- ▶ This Printer Driver does not support server OS or printer sharing.

12 Open the print folder.**For Windows 7:**

Click on the [Start] icon - [Control Panel] - [Hardware and Sound] - [Devices and Printers] and open the [Devices and Printers] folder.

For Windows 8.1:

Open the "Apps" screen and click [Control Panel] - [Hardware and Sound] - [Devices and Printers] and open the [Devices and Printers] folder.

For Windows 10:

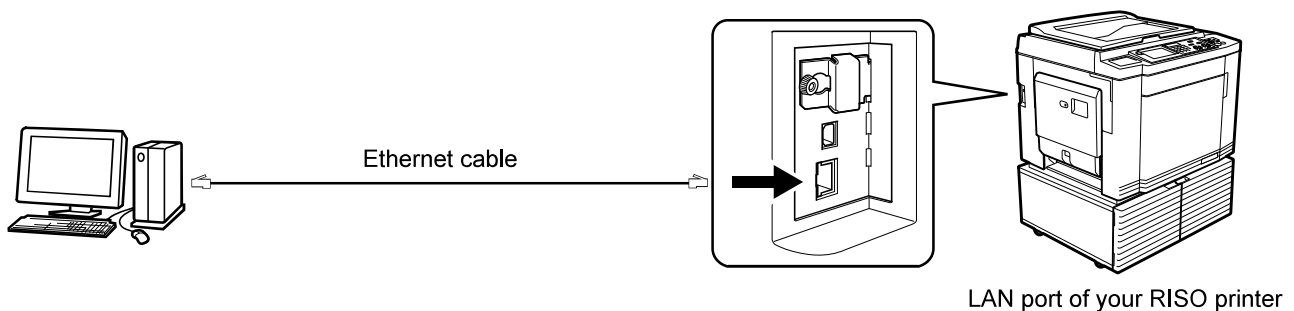
The optional network interface card, "RISO NETWORK KIT" is required when connecting the computer to the RISO printer through a network to use as a network printer.

Connect the RISO printer to the network and configure printer network settings (such as the IP address) in advance.

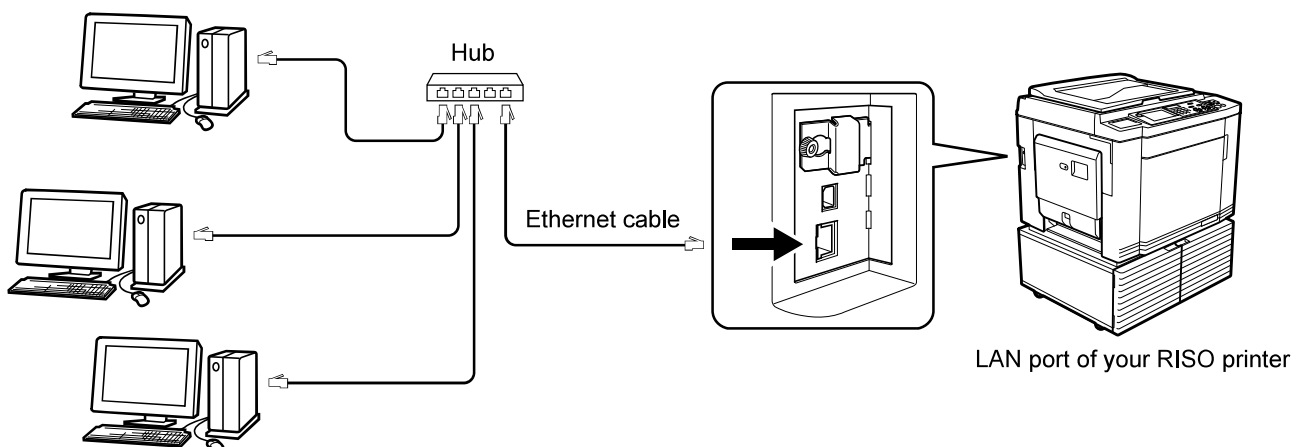


- ▶ Use a commercially available Ethernet STP cable (10BASE-T or 100BASE-TX, category 5 or higher) appropriate for your network environment. (You can use either a straight cable or crossover cable.)
- ▶ You cannot directly connect the machine to a communication line offered by a telecommunication carrier (such as a mobile communications company, fixed-line telecoms company, or Internet provider). When connecting the machine to a network, make sure it is connected via router.

Printer driver installation is now completed.
Proceed to create a dedicated folder in the USB flash drive. (27)

Creating a Folder

The procedure for creating a dedicated folder in a USB flash drive is described here.



- ▶ When printing by using a USB flash drive, be sure to create a dedicated folder in the USB flash drive. Printing is disabled from USB flash drives that do not have a dedicated folder.
- ▶ You cannot create a dedicated folder from [Printer Properties] in [Devices and Printers].



- ▶ Instead of the following procedure, you can also create a dedicated folder by connecting the USB flash drive to the printer.

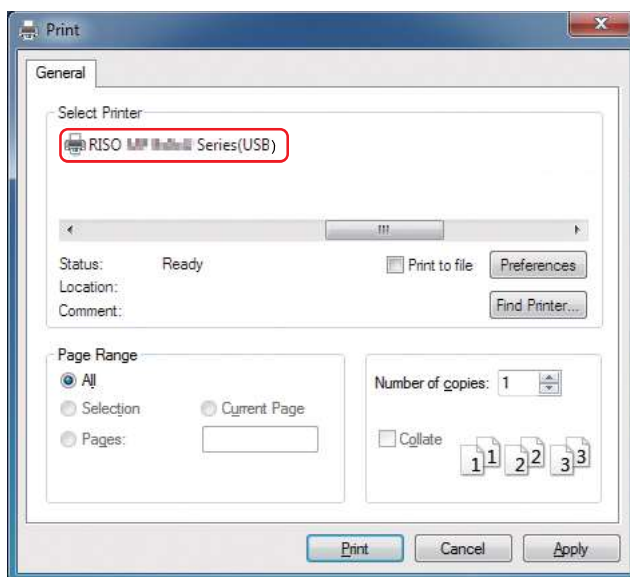
1 Connect the USB flash drive to the computer.

2 Display the [Print] dialog.

Open the original data on your computer, and select [Print] from the [File] menu.

3 Select the printer with the installed Printer Driver.

Be sure to select the USB flash-via-Printer Driver.



- ▶ The screen may vary depending on the application that you use.

4 Click [Preferences] to display the printer's properties.



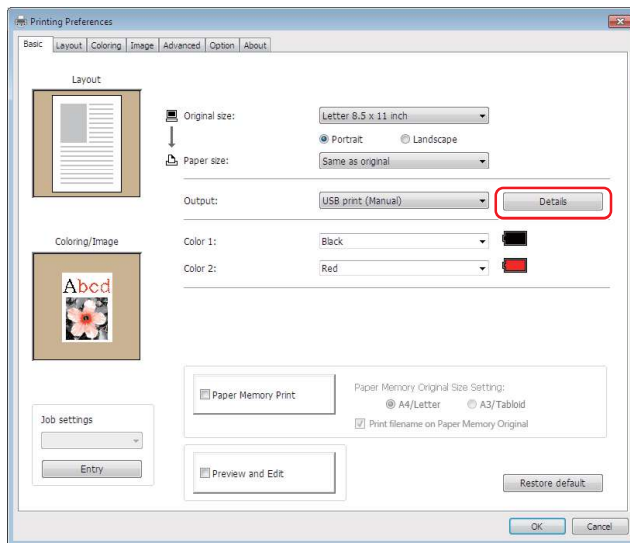
- ▶ A different button name for [Preferences] may be displayed depending on the application that you use.

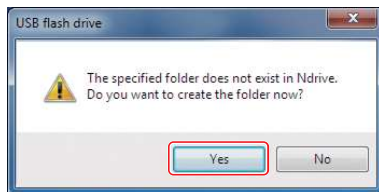

A dedicated folder is created in the USB flash drive.

Printing a test page

This section describes the procedures for printing a test page by using the USB flash-via-Printer Driver.



► Use a USB flash drive that has a dedicated folder (📖 27) in advance.

1 Open the print folder.

For Windows 7:

Click on the [Start] icon - [Control Panel] - [Hardware and Sound] - [Devices and Printers] and open the [Devices and Printers] folder.

For Windows 8.1:

Open the “Apps” screen and click [Control Panel] - [Hardware and Sound] - [Devices and Printers] and open the [Devices and Printers] folder.

For Windows 10:

Click on the [Start] icon - [Windows System] - [Control Panel] - [Hardware and Sound] - [Devices and Printers] and open the [Devices and Printers] folder.

For Windows 11:

Click on the [Start] icon - [All Apps] - [Windows Tools] - [Control Panel] - [Hardware and Sound] - [Devices and Printers] and open the [Devices and Printers] folder.

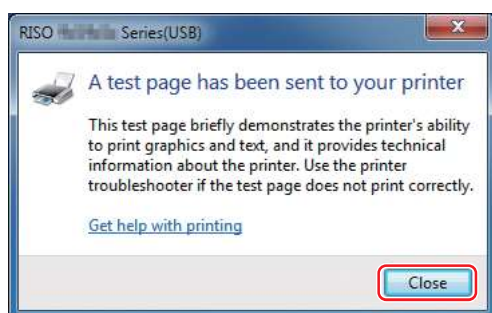
2 Open the properties of the printer with the installed USB flash-via-Printer Driver.

Right-click the icon of the installed printer (USB), and select [Printer Properties] in the displayed menu.

3 Click [Print Test Page].

4 When a message appears, click [Close].

The data of the test page is saved in the USB flash drive.



5 Load A4/Letter paper in the printer.

6 Remove the USB flash drive from the computer, and connect it to the printer.

■ For the SF5EII Series

The printer starts receiving data from the USB flash drive.

When the printer finishes receiving the data, it automatically starts printing.

After printing, the data in the USB flash drive is automatically deleted.

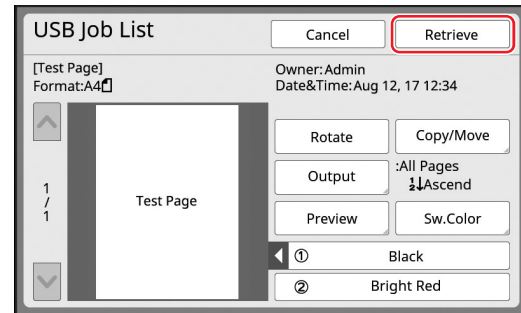
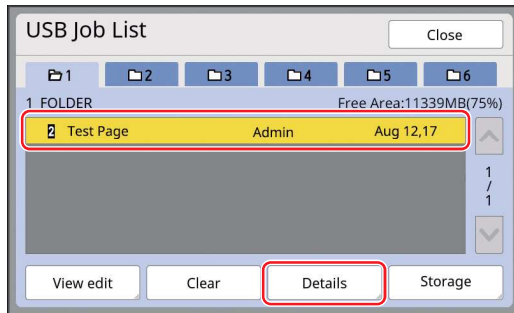
■ For Series other than the SF5EII Series

The [USB Job List] screen is displayed automatically.

If the screen is not displayed automatically, touch [USB flash drive] on the [Functions] tab screen.

① Select [Test Page] in [1_FOLDER], and touch [Details].

② Touch [Retrieve].



③ Press the Start key.

A test page is printed.

When using Paper Memory Print

- ▶ If the Printer Driver is manually installed, it will not function normally. Be sure to install the Printer Driver according to the following procedure.
- ▶ You must have administrator rights to install the Printer Driver on your computer.
- ▶ This Printer Driver does not support server OS or printer sharing.

1 Insert the [RISO Printer Driver] DVD-ROM into your computer's DVD-ROM drive.

The installer starts. If the installer does not start, double-click the [Setup(.exe)] file in the folder below.

For a 32-bit OS:

(DVD-ROM):[Windows 32-bit] folder

For a 64-bit OS:

(DVD-ROM):[Windows 64-bit] folder

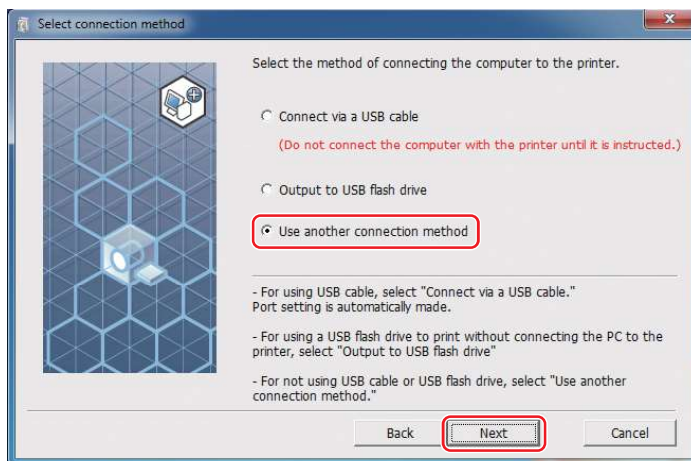


- ▶ If the [User Account Control] dialog appears, click [Yes].

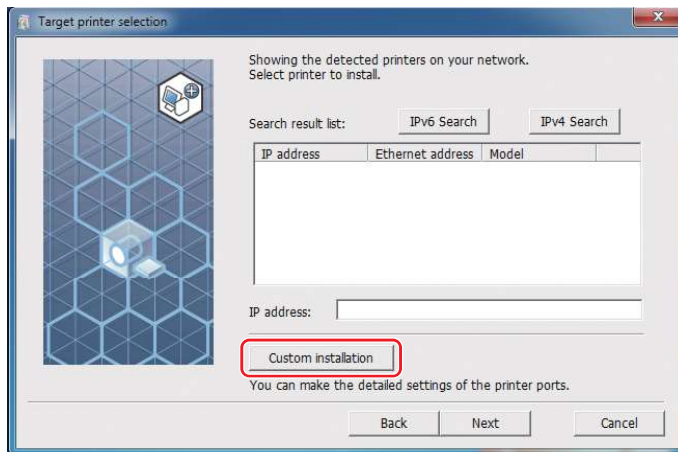

10 [Do you want to print a test page?] appears. Click [No].

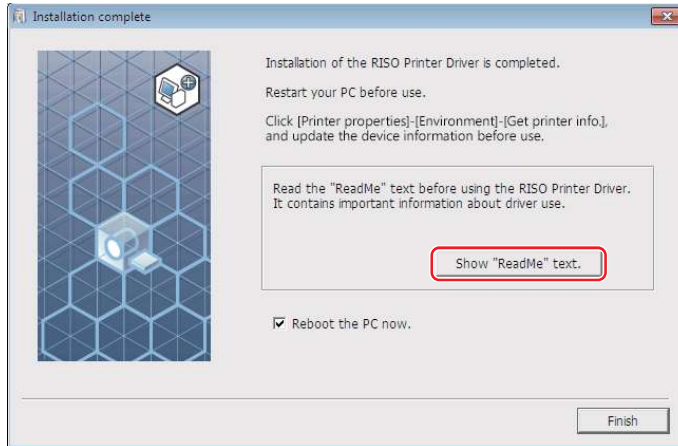
- A test page will not be printed even if you click [Yes] because the computer and printer are not connected.

11 Click [Show “ReadMe” text].

The ReadMe file is displayed. Be sure to read all the instructions and notes.



- ▶ Even if you click [Get printer info.], you will not be able to acquire information because your computer is not connected to the printer.
- ▶ To change the printer driver configuration, see [35](#).



12 Click [Finish].

Be sure to restart the computer before using the Printer Driver. If you selected [Reboot the PC now.], the computer will shut down and restart when you click [Finish].

13 Remove the [RISO Printer Driver] DVD-ROM from the DVD-ROM drive of your computer.



- ▶ Keep the DVD-ROM in a safe place.

Printer driver installation is now completed.

Changing the Printer Driver Configuration

Configure settings for customized use such as optional device registration, frequently-used custom paper sizes, print colors, and color information. If you do not change the Printer Driver configuration, you will not be able to select the corresponding option when specifying the print conditions of your print job.



► The screen-shots of the Printer Driver shown here are taken from the Printer Driver. (Not the USB flash-via-Printer Driver)

1 Open the printer folder.

For Windows 7:

Click on the [Start] icon - [Control Panel] - [Hardware and Sound] - [Devices and Printers] and open the [Devices and Printers] folder.

For Windows 8.1:

Open the “Apps” screen and click [Control Panel] - [Hardware and Sound] - [Devices and Printers] and open the [Devices and Printers] folder.

For Windows 10:

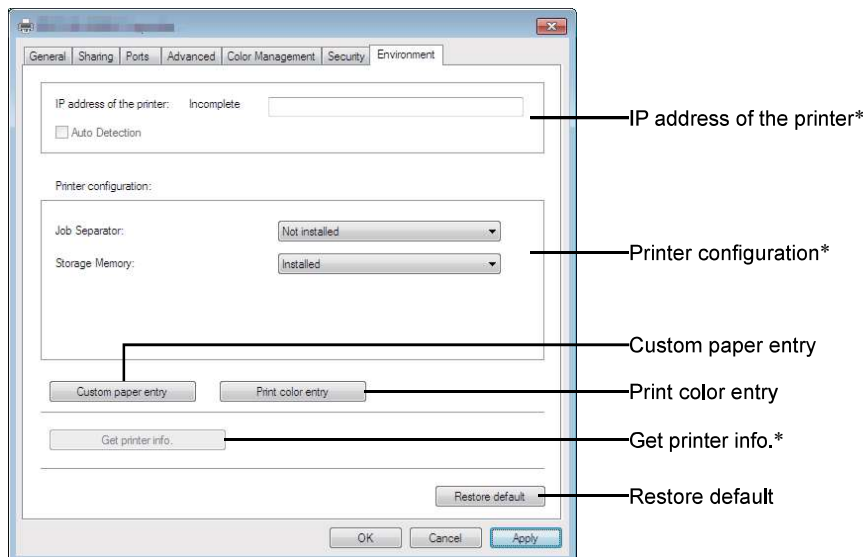
Click on the [Start] icon - [Windows System] - [Control Panel] - [Hardware and Sound] - [Devices and Printers] and open the [Devices and Printers] folder.

For Windows 11:

Right-click the corresponding RISO printer icon in the printer folder, and select [Printer Properties] in the displayed menu. Then click [Environment] in the [Properties] dialog.



* [IP address of the printer], [Storage Memory] under [Printer configuration], and [Get printer info.] do not appear in the USB flash-via-Printer Driver.

3 Register the options if needed.

■ Registering the IP address (Only in the case of network connection)

Configure settings to acquire printer information (ink colors and optional devices).

: Detects color information of the print color mounted on the printer every time you open the printer's properties to apply the information in [Color] for the Printer Driver. If you print without opening the printer's properties, the Printer Driver detects color information prior to printing, and the data is output with the print color mounted on the printer by temporarily applying the printer driver settings.

Not selected

: Color information is updated only when you click [Refresh] in the [Image] tab.

■ Setting the printer configuration manually

Change the optional device configuration. Set the following items manually.

Job Separator

Select [Installed] if your RISO printer is equipped with the Job Separator.

You can name and register the printer settings that you often use.

6 Paper Memory Print

If selected, the [Preview and Edit] tool starts up when a print instruction is issued, and the original data is automatically converted into a digital pattern. If you output the digital pattern from the [Preview and Edit] tool (74), you can use the data as a paper original, called a "Paper Memory Original". For more about the operation procedure for [Paper Memory Print], refer to "Procedure for Paper Memory Print" (79).

• For the MH9/SF9EII/SF5EII Series

In [Paper Memory Original Size Setting:], select whether to set Paper Memory Original to [A4/Letter] or [A3/Tabloid] for printing. Load paper of the selected size into the laser printer. (This is unrelated to [Paper size] (47).)

If [Print filename on Paper Memory Original] is selected, the filename will be printed on the footer of the Paper Memory Original. (MH9 Series only)



- For Paper Memory Original, the amount of data to be printed varies depending on the size. [A3/Tabloid] can print more data per sheet than [A4/Letter]. Therefore, using [A3/Tabloid] can reduce the number of sheets used.

• For the MF9/SF9x9 Series

The [A4/Letter] and [A3/Tabloid] options are not displayed. Load A4 or Letter size paper into the laser printer.



- If you use Paper Memory Original, you can print in high resolution similar to printing from a computer, even if the printer cannot be connected to a computer. Refer to the user's guide of the RISO printer for the use of Paper Memory Original.

7 Preview and Edit

■ This option is not available for mono-color printers.

If selected, “Preview and Edit” automatically starts up after clicking [OK] in the [Preferences] dialog. In “Preview and Edit” mode, you can edit and check the color separation before printing (📖 74).

Color : Select the print color from the drop-down list.

With combination print, the original data is automatically colored in two (on the assumption: color 1 of black and color 2 of red), the data is transmitted to your RISO printer and master making is performed. The printer will stop after master making is performed. Use the Combination print screen in the printer control panel to set the number of copies and press the start key.

[Use color separated data]:

[Use color separated data] uses the original color-separated data and prints it.

This option makes masters of odd pages with Drum (Cylinder) 1 and even pages with Drum (Cylinder) 2, therefore the first and second pages of the original are printed on the first copy, and the third and fourth pages of the original are printed on the second copy. When the total number of the original pages is odd, the master of the last page is made with Drum (Cylinder) 1 and no master is made with Drum (Cylinder) 2.

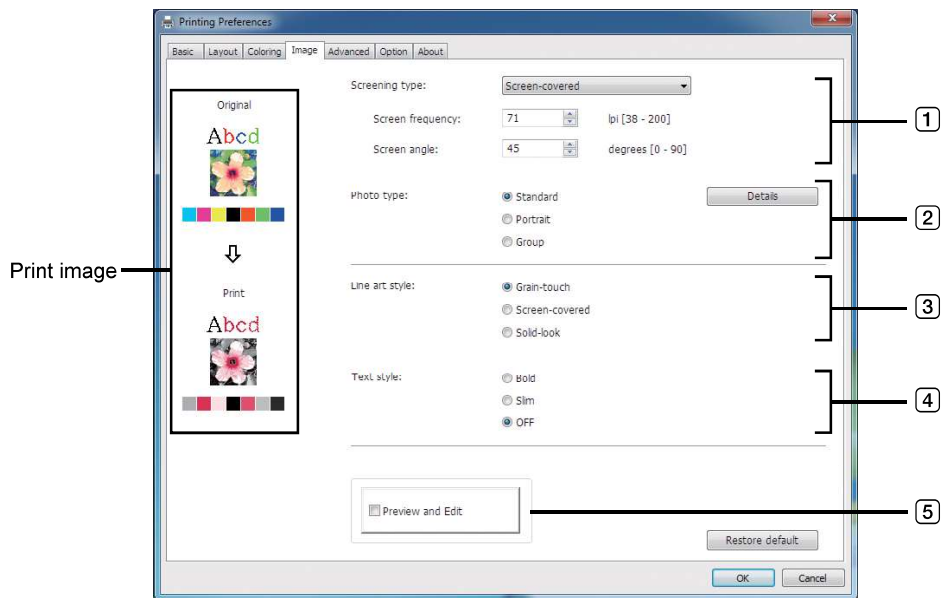

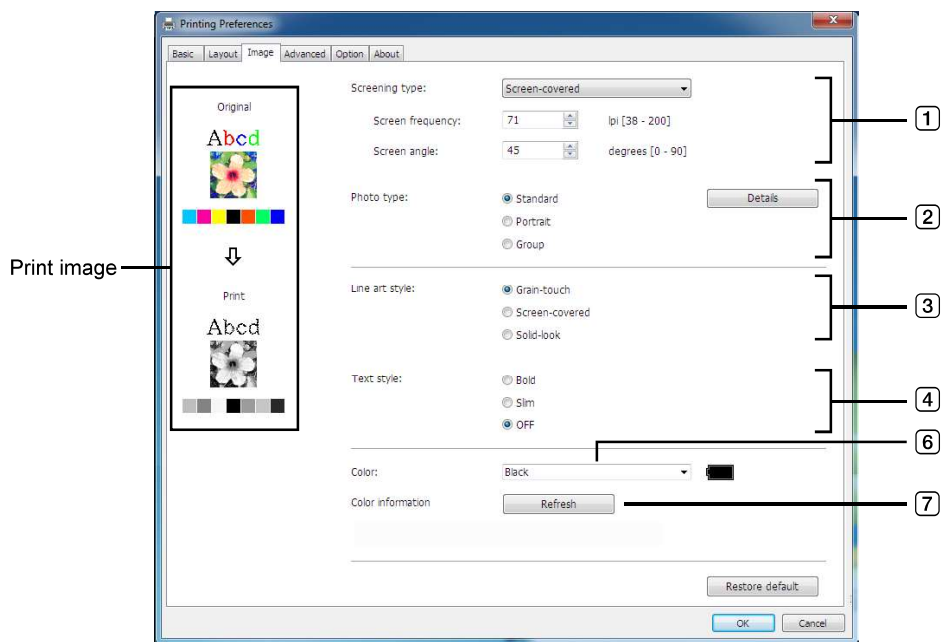

1 Screening type

You can select either of the following two styles for printing photos in your document data. The print result of the selected style of photos is displayed on the left side of the screen.

Grain-touch:

Various tones of photos are reproduced by changing the number of dots in an area according to original density. The printed photos will have a grain-touch appearance.

Screen-covered:

Various tones of photos are reproduced by changing the size of dots according to original density. The photos will be covered with a dot screen.

Though the wide range of tone levels in original photos can be kept in this style, their fineness will be lowered.

When you select [Screen-covered], you can set the screen-covered parameter.

Screen frequency

You can select the frequency of dots per inch (25.4 mm). You can select a value from 38 to 200. The default value is 71.

Screen angle

You can select the angle of dot direction to make adjustments against moire or other problems. You can select a value from 0 to 90. The default value is 45.

2 Photo type

Select the type of photo and set image finishing.

Standard

Clicking [Details] enables settings configuration for brightness and contrast.

Portrait

Use this setting for portraits of one or two individuals. This type of image processing is particularly good for printing photos of faces.

Group

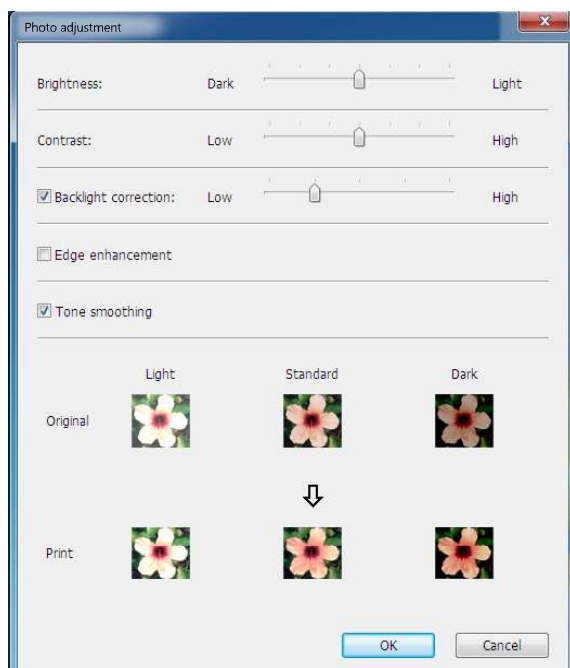
This setting is for group photos that are over-exposed. This process is effective for restoring facial features that have become washed out by a flash.

- Grain-touch** : This mode displays the color gradation. Bright colors are printed in light tone and dark colors are printed in deep tone.
- Screen-covered** : The text sections are displayed with halftone dots. This mode is unsuitable for small sized text.
- Solid-look** : This mode makes all text solid-look. You can use this mode to express the text clearly. The difference of each text color cannot be expressed.

④ Text style

You can adjust the thickness of text in this mode.

- Bold** : Makes the text thicker (to prevent fading).
- Slim** : Makes the text slimmer (to prevent blurring).
- OFF** : Doesn't adjust the text thickness.

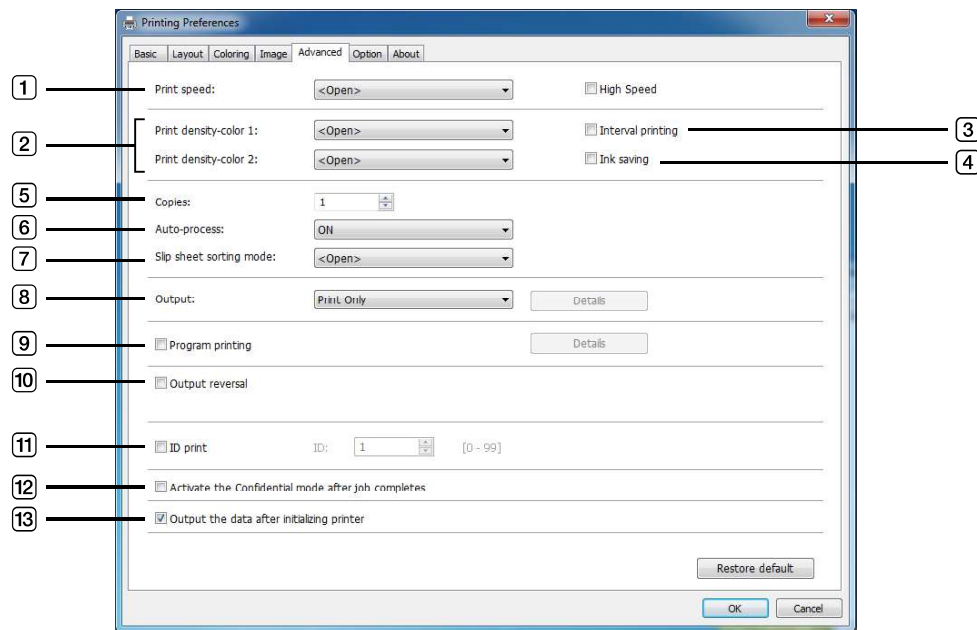

1 Print speed

Selects the print speed of the printer from 5 levels.

If it remains [Open], originals are printed at the speed set on the printer.

High Speed

Not displayed in the SF5x30EII Series.

Prints at the printer's fastest possible speed.

2 Print density

Selects the print density of the printer from 5 levels.

The print density can be set for Drum 1 and Drum 2 separately.

If it remains [Open], the original is printed at the density set on the printer.

3 Interval printing

By allowing the printer to skip a paper feeding during printing, the ink has time to dry, preventing it from leaving marks on the back of the next sheet.

4 Ink saving

The ink saving function of the printer is activated when this is selected. The volume of ink used for printing will be reduced compared to normal operation.

5 Copies

6 Auto-Process

You can specify how to process your print jobs on your RISO printer, such as completing them without interruption or interrupting them after a specified process step. By interrupting your print jobs, you can check print position and quality with test prints before the printing process or change the print job flow according to your print requirements. The available process flows are as follows.

ON:

Complete print jobs without operator involvement on your RISO printer. No pause is made between master-making and printing processes until the end of print jobs.

Pause before “Master-making”:

Interrupt print jobs before each master-making process, thus allowing you to handle a stack of printed copies, especially for duplex printing. You can view the page image on the LCD of the printer to check what you are about to print.

Pause before “Print”:

Interrupt print jobs before each printing process, thus allowing you to check a sample print.

OFF:

Interrupt print jobs before each process step, such as both master-making and printing processes.



- For the Printer Driver, [Auto-process] is available only when you select [Print Only]. (47) (The setting is not valid for [Storage Only].) For stored data, set the [Auto-process] mode from the printer display when the data is retrieved.
- [Slip sheet sorting mode] (62) and [Job separator] (65) can be set only when this is set to [ON].



- For the USB flash-via-Printer Driver, master-making/printing is executed according to the [Auto-process] setting made here when [Output] (47) is set to [USB print (Auto process)]. When using the "Preview and Edit" tool, always install the printer driver using the installer. (📖 10)

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Preview and Edit

With the [Preview and Edit] tool, you can perform data conversion (Paper Memory Originals) for Paper Memory Print on both mono and dual-color printers. You can also check and edit the results of coloring settings before printing on dual-color printers.

If you print at the [Preferences] dialog of the Printer Driver while [Preview and Edit] or [Paper Memory Print] (45), is selected, the [Preview and Edit] tool starts automatically. If [Paper Memory Print] is selected, Paper Memory conversion is performed after the [Preview and Edit] tool starts.



- You can also start the [Preview and Edit] tool from the Start menu. Use it when you want to edit a saved file again.

Click [Start] - [All Programs] - [RISO] - [(Your printer model) Series] - [Preview and Edit] in this order.

Appendix

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Error Message on computer's Display

Take actions as given below if the following error messages appear on your computer.

Message	Description	Action
The printer is not ready for printing. (The device is not ready.)	This message appears when your RISO printer requires paper or when it is not connected to your computer properly.	Replenish paper or check your RISO printer and the printer cable for poor connection, and then restart printing.
	This message also appears when the memory of your RISO printer becomes full during data transmission because the size of the document data is too large.	Reduce the file size of the document data or increase the value of the [Timeout] setting in your computer, and then restart printing.
Cannot print because an error is found in the current printer settings.	This message appears if the printer settings (such as paper size or print orientation) in the application and the Printer Driver do not match.	Change the printer settings in the application to make them identical with those in the Printer Driver or vice versa.



Operation Problems

Check your system setup as given below if you encounter the following operation problems. Contact your service representative for help if you cannot solve the problem.

No Printout

Problem	Cause / Condition	Action
Your RISO printer is not receiving data from your computer even after the print job finishes in the application.	Your computer is not properly connected to your RISO printer.	Connect the printer cable (or network cable) to both your computer and your RISO printer properly.
	The [RISO...] Printer Driver is not selected.	Select the Printer Driver and try printing again.
	[Printing] is displayed as the printer status when you open the [RISO...] printer monitor window.	Wait until the printer status display changes in the [RISO...] printer monitor window.
Your RISO printer cannot finish processing the current document data.	The printer cable (or network cable) was removed just after a print job started in the application. ([Printing] is displayed when you open the [RISO...] printer monitor window in this case.)	Reconnect the cable and cancel the current job in the [RISO...] printer monitor window. Then turn off the main power switch of your RISO printer. After approximately 10 seconds, turn it on again.
	[Pause] is displayed as the printer status when you open the [RISO...] printer monitor window.	Click [Restart] in the [Document] menu in the [RISO...] printer monitor window.
	The printer settings (such as paper size or print orientation) in the application and in the Printer Driver do not match.	Change the printer settings in the application to make them identical with those in the Printer Driver or vice versa, and repeat the print job from the application.
	The print job was canceled before completion in the application on your computer.	Turn off the main power switch of your RISO printer. After approximately 10 seconds, turn it on again.
Your RISO printer won't start making master when the documentation data is transmitted from your computer or your RISO printer won't start printing after making master.	If you set the [Auto-process] to a setting other than "ON", the process stops operation to wait for instructions.	Press the Start key on your RISO printer. The next process starts.

Unexpected Print Result

Problem	Cause / Condition	Action
Graphics cannot be printed properly.	The current [RISO...] printer driver was not selected as active when editing graphics.	Select the current [RISO...] Printer Driver and edit graphics again because graphics may not be printed properly if they are edited with another Printer Driver selected.
	The specified custom paper size was so large that unexpected margins were assigned on a page.	Select another paper size or specify a custom paper size within the valid range.
Images are reduced unexpectedly.	Are you using the correct Printer Driver for your RISO printer?	If the name of your RISO printer is different from the model name of your Printer Driver, the document data cannot be printed out correctly.
Some fonts cannot be printed properly.	The [Use Printer Font] option is selected in the application.	Deselect the [Use Printer Font] option in the application.
<p>The page image is not centered or is clipped at an edge.</p>  	The paper size setting in the application is not identical with that in the Printer Driver.	Make both paper size settings identical.
	The print area specified in the application is beyond the maximum print area of your RISO printer.	Increase the border margins in the application to contain the page image within the printable area of your RISO printer.
	There is something wrong with the Drum in your RISO printer.	Check your RISO printer and refer to the dedicated user's guide.
A solid black part on the original is hatched for printing.	Is the black part set to "K 100%" in CMYK mode?	If "K 100%" is specified in CMYK mode, a solid black part may be hatched for printing depending on the application used to create the original data. Specifying "R:0, G:0, and B:0" in RGB mode is recommended.

Unexpected Action

	Are you using a USB flash drive formatted for RISO folders?	Create a folder just for RISO files in the USB flash drive. (📖 27)

Unable to Specify Settings

Problem	Cause / Condition	Action
A name cannot be entered in the dialog to register a custom paper size.	The name is too long for the corresponding field.	Valid range of the length is 30 characters.
A desired value cannot be entered in the corresponding fields to register a custom paper size.	The value does not fall within the range.	Enter a value within the valid ranges into the relevant fields.
A custom paper size cannot be registered in the [RISO...] printer driver.	The relevant dialog was not closed correctly.	Click [OK] on the [Environment] tab after closing the [Custom paper entry] dialog. (📖 36)
The specified custom paper size cannot be selected in the application.	[Custom] is not selected in the [Paper Size] option in the [Properties] dialog of the Printer Driver.	Select [Custom] in the [Paper Size] option.
